- The school **recognises and supports pupils** with special needs - pupils who might face learning, linguistic and social challenges - through specific support and actions that are aimed to increase their learning success.

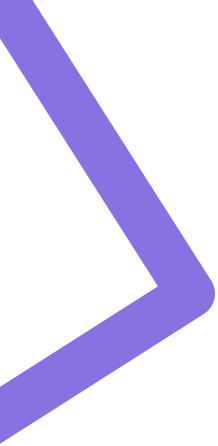

- The school has a **green action plan**.

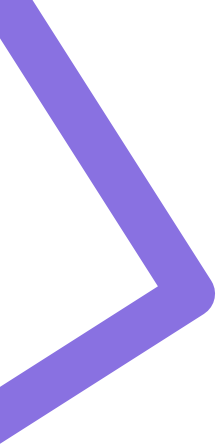

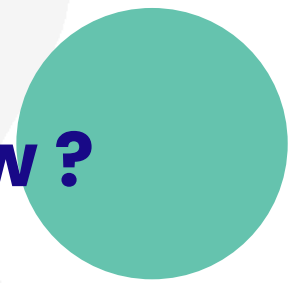

School Policies: crucial role in promoting inclusivity and sustainability

These policies can help schools to:

- Create a **safe and welcoming** environment for all students and staff
- Foster a sense of **community and belonging**
- Reduce the **school's environmental impact**
- **Prepare students** for the challenges of a changing world

When developing policies:

- it's important to involve **all stakeholders**, including students, staff, and community members
- Schools should also **regularly review and update** their policies to ensure that they remain relevant and effective in promoting inclusivity and sustainability.

Curriculum Activities

- Students can learn about issues related to sustainability, diversity, and inclusion in a meaningful way, and develop the skills needed to become active and engaged citizens.
- Examples of relevant activities include project-based learning and inquiry-based learning.
- Other activities that can support inclusivity and sustainability include:
 - Service learning projects
 - Debates and discussions
 - Field trips to local environmental or cultural sites
 - Student-led initiatives

Community Engagement

Schools can:

- partner with local businesses and community organizations to develop joint initiatives that promote environmental and social responsibility.
- organise events or activities that raise awareness about sustainability issues or celebrate diversity and inclusivity.
- make use of local resources and expertise that can help to support your school's goals.
- involve parents, community members, and other stakeholders in your efforts to create a shared sense of purpose and commitment to building a more sustainable and inclusive future.
